General Statement of Job Function: The Overhire Carpenter is responsible for the safe, accurate, and timely construction of all scenic elements assigned to them by the Technical Director (TD) and/or Shop Foreman (SF).

Principle Duties and Responsibilities:

- Complete all projects assigned by the TD and/or SF in an efficient, safe, and timely manner, while maintaining a high standard of quality.
- Ability to read, interpret, and build from construction drawings.
- Participate in the construction, load-in, rigging, technical notes, and strikes of all scenic elements.
- Participate in packing and transporting all scenic elements, tools, hardware, and materials required for all load-ins and strikes.
- Maintain a clean, safe, respectful, and collaborative work environment.
- Exhibit interpersonal savvy, which includes relating comfortably to many personalities, skills, and knowledge, cultivating and maintaining positive relationships, employing discretion, diplomacy, and tact, and seeking the positive in all situations.
- Comfortably and effectively cope with change and ambiguity, which includes effectively transitioning between tasks and timelines, identifying priorities and making good decisions with a minimum of information, and staying relaxed and proactive when things are uncertain.
- A commitment to an equitable work environment, which includes the use of gender-inclusive language, support for individual gender expression, racial equity, intergenerational collaboration, accessibility for people with disabilities, and cultural sensitivity.
- Ability to troubleshoot problems calmly and efficiently under pressure.
